

Latin and Greek Bingo

These Greek and Latin bingo files are designed for group classes, but can be played with just a few students.

These Greek and Latin roots, suffixes, and prefixes come from William Draper Swan's 1851 [Spelling Book](#) and Jessie MacMillan Anderson's 1897 [A Study of English Words](#). Most of the definitions come from these two books or Noah Webster's 1828 dictionary. For a few newer words without definitions, definitions were developed by 40L's director.

There are 4 games total, 16 roots for each game, with 2 games with Greek roots and 2 games with Latin roots. (32 Greek and 32 Latin roots total.)

You can combine cards and play multiple games with sets of roots as well, score bingo across the cards, 4 in a row anywhere across the cards for a win.

Needed files are combined here into one document with bingo files to print.

The first page to print is titled "Latin and Greek Bingo Card Master," it has roots and meanings for all 4 games. Print one for each student.

The next pages to print are a series of Latin and Greek Bingo cards. The first page starts with "Latin List 1," the bingo card for this list has a heart in the corner. There are 4 cards per page, 12 pages total. The symbols for each game correspond to the symbols on the master bingo card sheet. Each student needs a card from each list. The entire 12 pages has enough for a card for each game for 12 students. Print multiple copies of the same cards if you have more than 12 students. While the symbols are in color, you can also print in black and white.

The way the cards are set up without a center space, multiple students will sometimes win the bingo game at the same time even without duplicate cards. While a few students complain about this at first, they get used to it, especially if you laminate the cards and use small candies or chocolate chips as markers that they get to eat at the end of the game.

The final file to print is called "Greek and Latin Word Roots," 8 pages long. Print one per volunteer. While the students are looking up roots, the teacher or a volunteer reads the words and definitions that go along with that root.

For example, if your first bingo call for the Greek Root 1 bingo game set is the English meaning "life," students find life on their Bingo Card Master sheet and find its corresponding root "bio." They then find "bios, bio" on their Greek List 1 bingo card and place a marker on that spot. While students are finding the word on their card (after at least few students have found that life means "bio, bios," you would say, reading from your "Greek and Latin Word Roots,"

"bio means life."

"amphibious means living in both elements."

"a biography is a history of the life and character of a particular person" (you could simplify this to "a biography is a history of a person's life," depending on the age of your students.

"biology is the study of life."

Students may need help finding the root on their card. I let students who have found their root help others find their root on their card. You go on to pick and say the next English root meaning for students to look up their root after everyone in the class has placed their marker. You can choose the words randomly or roll a 16 sided dice. No repeats until the next game!

40L volunteers have found that looking up the roots while listening to words and definitions on bingo cards actually resulted in students learning more roots than a worksheet based root curriculum. It's also a fun way to end a lesson!
