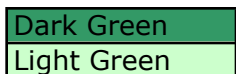

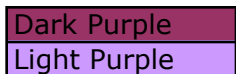

Red lowercase vowels will normally divide between the vowels, as in radi-o or me-ow

The amount of color shows the approximate percentage of time each letter team makes that sound.
